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A YEAR OF IMPACT FOR THE OCEAN

2024 saw glimmers of hope for marine conservation, driven by international collaboration, innovative technologies, and increased awareness of ocean health. Despite this positive progress, the challenges and threats to our ocean continue, and Sea-Changers' unique contribution funding communities to take action for the marine environments or species they understand best, feels more important than ever.

2024 was another year for varied grant programmes, which kept our team busy allocating and awarding grants:

- 9 new coastal water fountain locations received their grants.
- 15 projects received funding totalling just over £31,000 from Spring Main Grants.
- 21 projects received funding totalling just over £43,000 from Autumn Main Grants.
- 23 projects received funding totalling just over £9,000 from Small Grants.

Main grants projects each received between £800 and £2,500 and small grant projects £500 or less. Once again, we're proud to have funded projects all over the UK, from Cornwall to Aberdeen...and even land-locked Leicester!

We also received an unprecedented number of applications that we were unable to support due to lack of funding. In 2025, we have an ambition to grow the funds available by significantly increasing the support from new and existing corporate partners in order to meet the demand for our grants.

The sheer diversity of projects we fund can make it challenging to summarise, as we receive final evaluations many months after funding is received. That said, we are excited to share our 2024 impact with you and excited for what 2025 brings!

OUR VISION

Since giving out our very first grant in 2012, we have been supporting communities around the UK to conserve, protect and restore their precious coastal and marine habitats and species. Our vision is a future where the UK's seas and shores are clean and healthy and marine species and habitats are protected.

Through our various grants, we aim to:

- Harness people's love for the sea, inspiring them to contribute positively to its sustainability.
- Enable everyone who cares about the marine environment to make a difference.
- Support diverse, grassroots and communityled marine conservation all around the British Isles.

Sea-Changers' grants are unique in UK marine conservation. We provide a place for small, local and grassroots organisations to seek funding for their marine conservation activities, based on the priorities that they identify. This is a bottom-up rather than top-down approach to encourage community engagement, and has proven, year on year, to have wide ranging social, economic and environmental impacts.

To empower local communities and organisations that care about the marine environment, to identify and proceed with conservation projects that make a difference to its future.



DEMAND FOR OUR GRANTS IS GROWING

Demand for our grants now far outstrips the number we can support

- Applications have steadily increased (aside from the years affected by COVID 19).
- Awareness of our grants is growing.
- More people and projects are choosing to take action for marine and coastal environments and communities.

You will see that Bunzl Coastal Fountain Fund applications have slightly reduced. We have developed our guidance to help applicants better understand what permissions and funding is required to install and maintain their water bottle refill station. As a result, locations that were allocated grants in 2024 were installed and operational much quicker than in previous years.



2024 grants kept our team busy!

Main grants projects each received between £800 and £2,500 and small grants projects £500 or less. Once again, we're proud to have funded projects all over the UK.

MONTH	GRANTS PROGRAMME	OUTCOME/IMPACT
February	Innovation Fund (Evaluation Event)	 Held an online event for funders to hear from each Innovation Fund project. Wide ranging impacts shared including two projects that led to open access Al tools, useful to marine researchers globally.
March	Spring Main Grants	 Spring Main Fund allocated grants of up to £2,500: £30,000 allocated to 15 conservation projects Diverse approaches including engagement, research and direct clean-up action.
April	Bunzl Coastal Fountain Fund 2024	 Nine new coastal fountains added to the existing 30. Each can prevent the purchase of around 20,000 plastic bottles each year. That means c.780,000 bottles per annum that can't end up as litter!
May	Marine Conservation Social Fund	 Five new projects funded. All projects have a combined social and conservation benefit. Audiences include disadvantaged young people, people suffering from isolation and refugees.
September	Autumn Main Grants	 Autumn Main Fund allocated grants of up to £2,500: £43,000 allocated to 21 conservation projects projects ranging from promoting sustainable fishing practices, to inspiring the next generation of marine scientists.
October	Bespoke Reef Cubes Partnership	Partnership with Gwynt Glas for a collaborative Reef Cube installation at Falmouth Harbour in Cornwall won the Environment and Sustainability Award at the Global Offshore Wind Awards.
October	All Programmes (2024 Project Showcase Event)	 Funders heard amazing stories from four key funded projects covering social impact, innovation, plastic pollution and community engagement (see next page).

INNOVATION

Using thermal imaging and AI in monitoring seal populations

- Cutting-edge method for collecting data on seals with thermal imaging and drones
- New AI model for automatic analysis for faster and less impactful seal counts and ID
- Never before seen dolphin behaviour captured - attack by bottlenose dolphins on harbour porpoise

Sea voyages for disadvantaged young people, removing ocean plastics.



COMMUNITY ACTION

Supporting a team of citizen scientists to protect a unique habitat.



OUTCOMES:

- 22 miles of coastline cleaned.
- 742kg marine plastic collected.
- 23 vulnerable people supported.

Mike's Dive Store customers and followers can learn about projects all around the UK acting to protect and conserve the marine environment.


